It is over 10 years since Goodwood revived the famous historic motor circuit. Since then the Revival has become the most successful historic motor racing meeting in the world and the only major sporting event to take place completely to a period theme. Set in the 1950s and 60s, in celebration of the time that such great racing heroes as Stirling Moss, Jim Clarke, Mike Hawthorn, Jack Brabham and Jackie Stewart all diced wheel to wheel on this great historic track, no detail has been left unattended – the whole experience is a “magical step back in time” and quite unlike anything else. A unique experience for your guests and entertaining in a way that so much motor sport nowadays is not, the Revival is not only beautiful to look at but also jaw-droppingly competitive with enormously valuable racing cars being driven right on the edge. This most glamorous of weekends can’t fail but to engage and enthrall even the most world-weary of guests.

Cars and drivers come together from all over the world to recreate racing as it used to be in the halcyon days of the sport – noisy, sexy, fast and furious. The skies are even filled with warbirds such as Spitfires, Mustangs and Hurricanes as the world’s most valuable racing cars do battle below them on the track. This is like a massive film set in which everyone has a part to play.

SALVADORI PAVILIONS

Salvadori is the ultimate location to enjoy the Revival. This Art Deco themed pavilion occupies a prestigious position on the inside of the circuit next to the chicane, with views towards Woodcote Corner and down towards the Start/Finish line. The great views from the balcony together with the option of taking your own private pavilion and a garden, make this the most desirable location for entertaining.



CLARK & BRABHAM

These two buzzing restaurant areas are ideal for small groups of people and perfect for those who really enjoy being in the centre of the activity. The pavilions are right next to the assembly area which is alive with pre-race activity and tension.



THE GOODWOOD REVIVAL WEEKEND

The action takes place over three days, Friday 18th, Saturday 19th and Sunday 20th September 2009 (date subject to FIA confirmation)



SUPERSHELL BUILDING

This famous Goodwood landmark is situated on the outside of Woodcote Corner, one of the fastest and most dramatic corners of the circuit. From here you are just literally feet from the action. Guests also have seats in the nearby Woodcote Grandstand, one of the best positions on the circuit and Goodwood's own period taxis will be on hand to transport you and your guests to the Paddock area.



HAWTHORN PAVILIONS

These private trackside pavilions are positioned just beyond the Start/Finish line. They front onto a lawn where you can sit in the sun and sip champagne with your guests, just a few feet from some of the most exciting motor racing in the world.

Friday is official practice day with drivers pushing ever harder to set their personal fastest lap times. Their performances today establish their grid positions for their racing. Friday is also Bonhams Auction viewing and sale day.

Saturday is all-day racing (save for one qualifying session for the Royal Automobile Club TT race). Highlights include the hugely popular St Mary's saloon car race featuring a host of famous drivers. Grand Prix cars, sports cars and motorcycles will also race today. Saturday is also Ladies' Day where the fashion is almost as spectacular as the racing.

Sunday is all racing action too, but featuring the sensational one-hour, two-driver and star-studded Royal Automobile Club TT Celebration (for sixties GT cars). Grand Prix cars, sports cars and motorcycles also race today and there will be a second round of the St Mary's saloon car race.

Action on the track is from approximately 9am on Friday and 10am on Saturday and Sunday and finishes at approximately 6pm each day. The bar is open from 10am on Friday and Saturday, and 11am on Sunday until 6pm each day.
