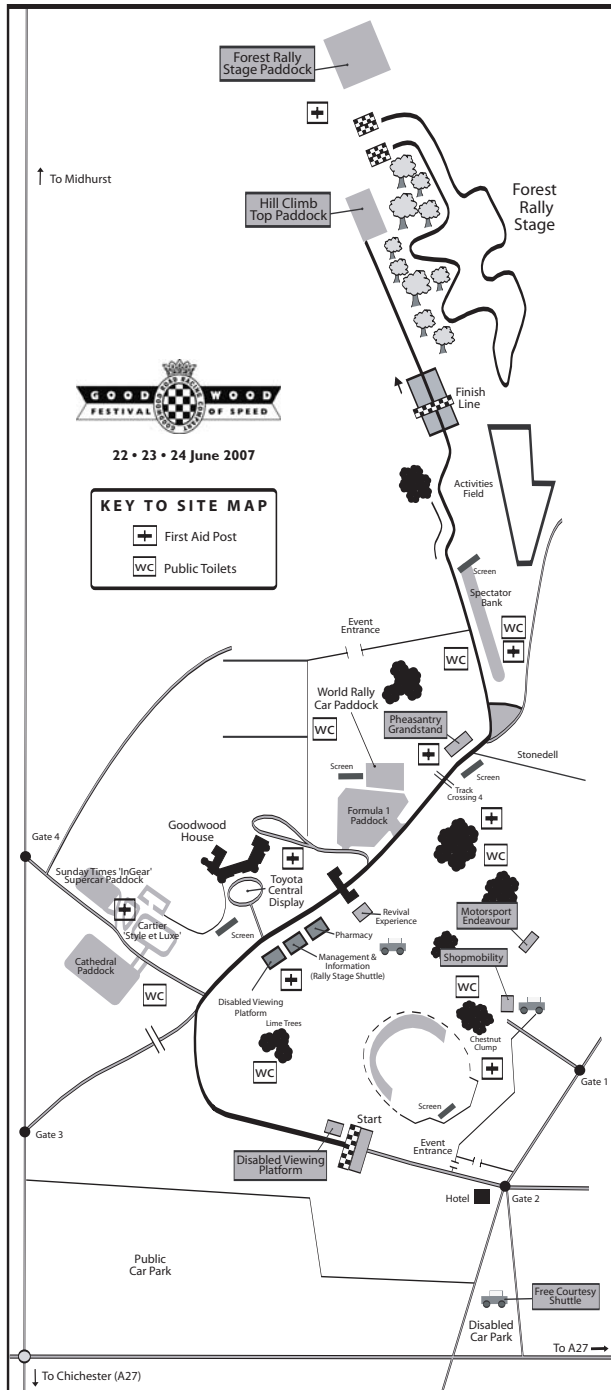


## SITE MAP

## Information for Disabled Visitors

Goodwood welcomes persons with disability to the Festival of Speed. We have a range of dedicated facilities across the event site especially designed to meet the needs of visitors with impaired mobility, enabling you to catch all the action and experience the event to the full. We hope that you have a wonderful weekend at Goodwood.

### FACILITIES

#### Road Signs

On approaching the event site, standard yellow AA road signs, marked with the symbol for disabled visitors, will direct you to the dedicated disabled car parks.

#### Car Parks

There is a dedicated car park for disabled visitors. A free courtesy vehicle service operates from the car park and will take you directly to the entrance of the event or to Shopmobility.

#### Returning to your car

The courtesy vehicle service will deliver you back to the car parks at any time during the event. You can book a courtesy vehicle either at Shopmobility or at the Management and Information Office; your driver will then collect you and return you to your car.

#### Shopmobility

Electric and manual wheelchairs are available to hire from Shopmobility, which is based inside Gate 1, at the southern end of the exhibition site. For further information about the facilities offered by Shopmobility, please telephone: +44 023 9245 5444.

#### Temporary Access

Disabled visitors should be aware that the Festival of Speed site is built within a country park. Although we endeavour to maintain good conditions underfoot, please be aware that there may be uneven ground. There are no permanent roadways within the site. We lay over 7km of temporary roads to ease movement around the park. The ground surface is grassland. All the car parks are also on grassland.

## THE ACTION

### Dedicated Viewing Platforms

There are two dedicated raised viewing platforms. One is located next to the Management and Information Office opposite Goodwood House and has a great view of the large video screen in front of the House; the other is situated alongside the Startline Grandstand. There is also wheelchair access and space undercover within the Pheasantry Grandstand: tickets can be purchased from the ticket office on 01243 755055 or from staff at the grandstand depending on availability.

### Large Viewing Screens

For ease of viewing, across the event site, there are 7 large screens. The screens will be showing on-track footage and are situated: in front of Goodwood House, at the Cricket Pitch, in the Activity Field, by Track Crossing 4, Park side, Formula One Paddock, Forest Rally Stage and at Turn One.

### Battery Re-Charging

Both Disabled Viewing Platforms have battery re-charging facilities for your motorised wheelchairs.

### Toilets

There are nine disabled toilets, one at each of the following main toilet block areas: Lime Trees in the main Park Area; behind Crossroads Grandstand; Stonedell behind the Ice House Catering Village; Chestnut Clump to the north of the cricket pitch; Pheasantry Field; Formula One Paddock, north of the Press Centre; Activity Field; Top Paddock; and beside the raised viewing platform next to the Management and Information Office. There are disabled toilets in the disabled Car Park and in Car Park S, Car Park M and Car Park A. Please note that at the Festival of Speed a number of the disabled toilets use the Radar Key system, if you do not have a key please see the information listed below. Keys will also be available from the attendants at the Toilets. You may also obtain a Radar key from the Information offices. Please be aware that the keys must be returned after use. ### Pharmacy

Provision has been made for any medical or first aid incident; first aid points are located throughout the site; Sussex Ambulance and St John Ambulance provide this cover. There are several doctors on call throughout the event site; they can be contacted at the Management and Information Office, or via any Goodwood staff member, who will be able to ensure that a doctor is directed to you straight away. There is an on-site pharmacy providing a consultation service, emergency prescriptions, medicines, toiletries, suntan lotion and earplugs, located behind the Park Grandstand. There are two treatment centres onsite. One next to management and information and one behind Pheasantry Grandstand; for medical assistance from doctors.

### Camping Facilities

The campsite at the event is fully equipped to meet the needs of visitors with disability, with disabled toilets and showers. This needs to be booked prior to the event by phoning the ticket office on 01243 755055.

Motorsport Endeavour – The sole purpose of the Motorsport Endeavour Club is to involve people with a wide range of disabilities in program of car and motorcycle events. Motorsport Endeavour involves people as riders, navigators, marshals, timekeepers, administrators and spectators as well as drivers. Previous experience is not a pre-requisite - the emphasis is on familiarisation and fun.

### Forest Rally Stage

The rally drivers will experience a much improved course from that used at Goodwood for the inaugural Forest Rally Stage in 2005. Over the winter, the stage has been made bigger and better - thanks largely to rallying legend and former World Champion Hannu Mikkola, who acted as Goodwood's consultant. Cars now drive down the original 2.5-kilometre loose-surface stage - widened in places to make it faster, safer and more spectacular - but instead of returning to the start/finish via the same route, cars now use a series of new cuttings designed by 'Flying Finn' Mikkola to make a high-speed circuit. This allows more than one car on the stage at one time, better spectating and an increase in the action and excitement. A dedicated rally car paddock on the grassland close to Goodwood Racecourse brings the atmosphere of a World Rally Championship service area to the Downs. For disabled visitors, a complimentary shuttle service will be operating from the Management and Information Office up to the Forest Rally Stage. The drivers will arrange a collection time with you, and will return you to the main event site, whenever you are ready. Please be aware that while every effort has been made to make the Rally Stage enjoyable for all visitors, its forest setting does mean that the terrain underfoot will be uneven.

### Paddocks

Each of the main paddock areas is accessible by disabled visitors. The Formula One paddock located north of Goodwood House is principally for post-war single seater open wheeled cars, including historic and contemporary Formula One cars, as well as some modern sports cars and all motorcycles. The Supercar Paddock contains the current production and planned-production supercars taking part in the Sunday Times 'In Gear' Supercar Paddock. Cathedral Paddock located west of Goodwood House, is principally for all pre-war cars, plus sports and touring cars (having enclosed bodywork) and saloon-based cars.

### Helicopter Pleasure Flights

For an amazing aerial view of the whole event, there is nothing better than a pleasure flight in a helicopter. Enquiries for a flight may be made at the Elite Helicopter stand close to the helicopter landing site in to the south of Track Crossing 4.

Please note that although we do offer a shuttle service to the Forest Rally Stage, this is not extended to a shuttle service around the Festival of Speed site.
